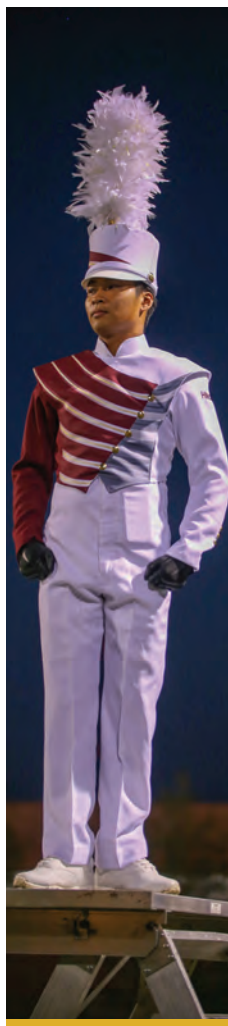
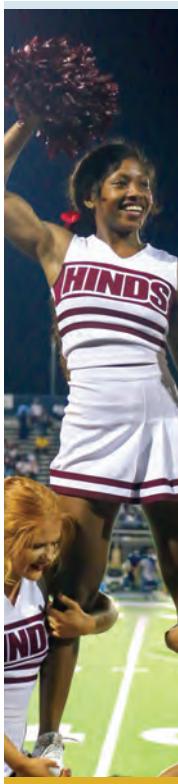

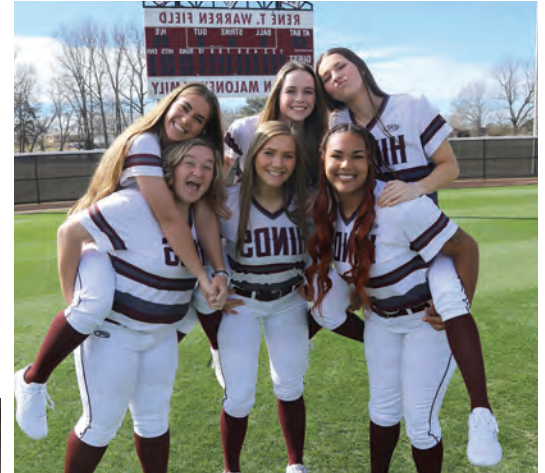
NURSING ALLIED HEALTH CENTER

Academic Transfer Programs

If you are ultimately pursuing a bachelor's degree from a four-year college or university, then academics will be your path at Hinds.

Your Degree

No matter what your major may be, you'll follow an academic plan at Hinds that leads to an Associate of Arts (AA) degree. An AA degree is the halfway point to a bachelor's degree! So, whether you are majoring in biology, business, social work, kinesiology, fine arts, education, political science – or more than 200 other majors – your AA degree is how it all starts.

The academic courses in an AA degree match the first two years of university coursework. So, you'll take the same core coursework at Hinds that you would in your first two years at a university - but for a fraction of the cost.

Your Transfer

We work hard to make sure you have a smooth transfer to any university in Mississippi. We have a formal articulation agreement with the Mississippi Institutions of Higher Learning that outlines every class you need at Hinds for over 200 bachelor's degree programs. When you follow an articulated program of study, your academic courses are guaranteed to transfer!

Before you register for classes at Hinds, you'll meet with an advisor who will help you choose your path and build a program map to keep you on track for a seamless transfer. You can also build your own transfer guide at matttransfertool.com.

Adult Education

Need a high school diploma? We offer free classes to prepare you for a High School Equivalency (HSE) diploma, such as the GED.

The MI-BEST program takes you to the next level by allowing you to work on an equivalency diploma and college courses at the same time:

- MI- BEST students get help with academic skills while also enrolled in a career/tech program.
- Financial aid is available to qualifying MI-BEST students!

Get Admitted

At Hinds, it's easy to enroll, and there's no application fee! We offer an open-door policy that offers all students a path to general admission.

Application Checklist

- Apply online at hindscc.edu/apply.
- First-Time Freshmen: submit official ACT or SAT scores, and submit your final, official high school transcript after you graduate.
- College Transfers: submit the official college transcript from the last college you attended showing a passing letter grade in both English and Math.
- After your application is accepted by the Office of Admissions, you'll receive an acceptance email with your Student ID and instructions for accessing your My.Hinds account.

Transcript Tips:

- Do not email or fax transcripts and test scores.
- Your school can mail a sealed transcript to Hinds Community College, Office of Admissions, P.O. Box 1100, Raymond, MS 39154.
- We also accept electronic transcripts from approved transcript agencies (ex: Parchment, eSscript, NSCH.) Select the PDF option and request the transcript be sent directly to Hinds.
- You may also bring an official transcript to any Hinds campus as long as it is still in the school's sealed envelope.



My.Hinds & Navigator

My.Hinds

My.Hinds is the portal to your student account. It's the official location for you to view and use college resources, such as:

- your Hinds email
- your Navigator Account
- the housing portal
- the academic calendar, handbook, and other important college documents
- free software downloads such as Microsoft Office, Excel, and PowerPoint

Navigator

Navigator is where you take care of college business and manage your student information, including:

- completing Onboarding
- viewing your financial aid and award status
- viewing your class schedule and making schedule changes
- tracking your academic progress and grades
- viewing your balance, making payments, and setting up payment plans

Log In

After your application is accepted by the Office of Admissions, you'll receive an acceptance email with your Student ID and a default password that is used for logging into all student platforms at Hinds, such as My.Hinds, Navigator, Canvas, and your Hinds email.

The place to start is My.Hinds! Go to my.hindscc.edu to log in for the very time with these credentials:

- **HindsNet ID:** this will be the first letter of your last name (capitalized) + your seven-digit Student ID.
- **Default Password:** this will be the first letter of your first name (capitalized) + the first letter of your last name (capitalized) + your eight-digit DOB (MMDDYYYY) + \$\$

Once you are logged in to My.Hinds, you will reset your password. Next, from the My.Hinds dashboard, you can open many platforms such as Navigator and your Hinds email.

Complete Onboarding

After your admission application is accepted, it's time to complete Onboarding! Onboarding allows you to set up your student preferences and establish residency in one place. This is important for Mississippi residents to pay in-state tuition.

- Log into My.Hinds and from the dashboard, click on the Navigator button. This takes you to your Navigator account which is full of your student information.
- Inside Navigator, click on your Inbox to start completing your Onboarding action items. Be sure to click through each task until you get to the end.



Paying for College

A college education doesn't have to break the bank. Financial aid may be available to help you pay for college. Find out what you may qualify for by applying early for various types of aid.

Mississippi Aid

Mississippi residents may apply for state aid at msfinancialaid.org:

- Mississippi Tuition Assistance Grant (MTAG)
- Mississippi Eminent Scholar Grant (MESG)
- Higher Education Legislative Plan (HELP)

Federal Aid

Work-Study

- Work-study if financial aid you earn by working on campus! You must have a FAFSA on file to qualify. Apply at hindsc.edu/financialaid.

Veteran Benefits

- For veterans and students with veteran parents, we can help you apply for veteran benefits. Get started at hindsc.edu/veterans.

Financial Aid Checklist

- Apply for admission at hindsc.edu/apply.
- Apply for federal aid by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at studentaid.gov.
- Apply for state aid (Mississippi Residents) at msfinancialaid.org. Be aware of application deadlines: HELP Grant deadline is March 31, and MTAG and MESG deadline is September 15.
- When applying for federal aid, enter Hinds' school code 002407 (for all 6 Hinds locations) and use the "IRS Data Retrieval" option to ensure prompt awarding.
- Apply for scholarships and Veteran benefits, if eligible. Some scholarships have deadlines. For a list of scholarships, deadlines, and applications, visit hindsc.edu/scholarships
- After your FAFSA is reviewed, you may be asked to submit additional documents. If so, you will be notified by email and through your Navigator account. So, be sure to check your email and Navigator account regularly and then submit all required documents you see listed under your Financial Aid action items.
- Once your FAFSA is complete, you'll receive an email notifying you to view your award in Navigator.
- If awarded, financial aid will be available for the payment of your Hinds fees 10 days prior to the first day of classes, as long as you have submitted all required admission documents.



Scholarships

How to Apply for Hinds Scholarships

- First, apply for general admission to Hinds and you'll receive your Student ID via email.
- Next, access individual scholarship applications at hindsc.edu/scholarships.
- Be sure to review each scholarship opportunity so you don't miss a deadline.
- Some scholarships will require you to log into our scholarship portal, ScholarshipUniverse.

ScholarshipUniverse

- ScholarshipUniverse (SU) is the scholarship portal for many scholarships offered by Hinds, but it also helps you search for private scholarships offered by companies and organizations all over the United States.
- After applying for admission to Hinds and receiving your Student ID, you can log into SU, create your profile, and start matching to scholarship opportunities!

ACT Freshman Scholarship

Award: Eligible freshmen may receive the following award for up to four consecutive semesters (excluding summer terms)

20-23	ACT Faculty Scholarship of \$1,000/semester
24-27	ACT Dean's Scholarship of \$1,500/semester
28+	ACT Presidential Scholarship of \$3,000/semester

Deadline: First day of classes of the first freshman semester.

Qualifications:

- Submit an official ACT composite score or superscore of 20 or above. An ACT superscore is the average of a student's highest sub-scores in each of the four subject areas from all of their ACT attempts.
- Be a first-time entering freshman, meaning Hinds must be the first college you attend after receiving your high school diploma or high school equivalency diploma.
- Be admitted as a Mississippi resident and U.S. citizen.
- No scholarship application is required for the ACT Freshman Scholarship. This is a direct award, and eligible candidates will automatically receive the scholarship after all requirements are met.

Foundation Scholarship

Foundation scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis to students who demonstrate academic excellence, a desire for achievement, involvement in extracurricular activities, and/or financial need.

Award: Amounts vary, awarded every fall semester

Deadline: February 15

Qualifications:

- Submit two letters of recommendation.
- Submit a typed resume.
- Submit official high school transcript and college transcripts, if applicable, showing a GPA of 2.0 or higher.
- Submit official ACT scores.
- Submit a FAFSA (optional).

Valedictorian & Salutatorian Scholarships

Awarded to high school seniors graduating as Valedictorian or Salutatorian from an accredited high school in Mississippi.

Award: Two-year, half-tuition scholarship

Deadline: July 1 Priority Deadline

Qualifications:

- Submit an official, final high school transcript verifying your class rank as 1st or 2nd in your class from an accredited high school in Mississippi.
- Must be a first-time entering freshman, meaning Hinds must be the first college you attend after receiving your high school diploma.
- Be admitted as a Mississippi resident and U.S. citizen.

Utica STEM-Up Scholarship

Generous financial packages are available to students majoring in STEM fields on our Utica Campus. If you are interested in the areas of Science, Technology, Engineering, or Math, we invite you to explore the UC3T STEM-UP Initiative, sponsored by the National Science Foundation. We challenge students to achieve the highest level of intellectual and personal development, focusing on problem-solving, critical thinking, use of technology, STEM research and successful university transfer. Honors Scholarships

The Honors Institute, housed on the Rankin and Raymond Campuses, offers Honors classes, leadership opportunities and international study in an enhanced and supportive learning environment. To join, students must complete an Honors application and submit two letters of recommendation. Honors program members are eligible for Honors Scholarships. All Hinds Scholarships require full-time enrollment in 15 or more credit hours each semester.

Eagle Scout & Gold Award Scholarships

A one-time award for graduating seniors who achieve Eagle Scout rank through the Boy Scouts of America or the Gold Award through the Girl Scouts of the United States of America.

Award: One time \$500 award

Deadline: First day of classes of the first freshman semester

Qualifications:

- Submit a copy of your award certificate or letter from a council leader.
- Must be a first-time entering freshman, meaning Hinds must be the first college you attend after receiving your high school diploma or high school equivalency diploma.
- Be admitted to Hinds as a Mississippi resident and as a U.S. citizen.

Career & Technical Competition Winner

Awarded on a competitive basis to graduating seniors who placed first in a Skills USA, HOSA, FBLA, DECA, FFA, or TSA competitive event while enrolled in a high school career or technical program.

Award: Two-year, half-tuition scholarship

Deadline: July 1 Priority Deadline

Qualifications:

- Submit evidence of your first-place award in an approved career/technical competition.
- Enroll in an approved career or technical program.
- Must be a first-time entering freshman, meaning Hinds must be the first college you attend after receiving your high school diploma or high school equivalency diploma.
- Be admitted as a Mississippi resident and U.S. citizen.

HSE Scholarships

Awarded to eligible high school equivalency (HSE) diploma recipients.

Award: Eligible candidates may qualify for one of these awards:

- First-Class-Free-Award: equivalent to the cost of one three-credit hours class

- HSE Achievement Scholarship: \$1,000/semester for HSE diploma recipients with outstanding scores: GED - 640 or above; HiSET - 75 or above; TASC - 2800 or above

Deadline: First day of classes of the first freshman semester

Qualifications:

- Submit official HSE diploma transcript.
- Must be a first-time entering freshman (Hinds is the first college you attend after receiving your HSE diploma.)
- Must be at least 17 years of age.
- Be admitted as a Mississippi resident and U.S. citizen.

Resident Assistant Award

Award: in-state tuition, room, and board

Resident Assistants (RAs) serve as student leaders in our Residence Halls, providing support to professional housing staff with day-to-day operations. RAs also serve as facilitators, mediators and a resource for residential students. Because of their responsibilities and leadership role, RAs receive a generous financial aid package. RA applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or above. To apply, visit hindscc.edu/housing.

Register for Classes

After completing your admission requirements, you are ready to register for classes. Registration takes place before the fall, spring, and summer terms each year. View the registration dates for the upcoming semester at hindscc.edu/enroll.

All new students and returning students who have not attended Hinds for at least one semester must be advised before registering for classes. You will not be able to register online in your student account. A Hinds advisor will first talk with you about your college and career goals, and help you pick the right classes

How to Register

- ❑ First, check your Applicant Portal to make sure your test scores and/or transcripts have arrived.
- ❑ Next, complete Onboarding in your Navigator account. See page 8 for details.
- ❑ Now you are ready to be advised and registered by a Hinds Advisor! The student should initiate advisement and registration in one of these ways: 1) by coming in-person at any Hinds campus. No appointment is necessary. Simply visit the Advising Office at any Hinds campus during business hours; or 2) by submitting a Remote Advisement Request Form at hindscc.edu/register. If you request remote advisement, an Advisor will reach out to you in several business days through your Hinds email. So, be sure to check it regularly!

Testing Tips:

- If you are a first-time college student who has not had the ACT or SAT or received college credit, you will be required to take the Accuplacer. It is free and given at all Hinds campuses. To find a test time and location, visit hindscc.edu/testing.
- If your ACT or SAT scores place you in a development course that you would like to try and test out of, you can challenge your course placement by taking the Accuplacer for \$5 per section.
- You can prepare in advance for the Accuplacer at accuplacer.org

Residence Life

Welcome Home

Residence halls are offered on our Raymond and Utica campuses. Living on campus will put you in the middle of the action for the full college experience, while allowing you the chance to live with new friends and make great memories. Living on campus means easy access to classes, learning resources, free tutoring, recreational facilities, athletic events and more.

Housing Checklist

- Log in to My.Hinds and click on Res Life to complete the housing application. View housing application dates at hindscc.edu/housing.
- At the time you apply for housing, your My.Hinds account will be charged the non-refundable room reservation fee.
- Attend a new student orientation. Before the semester begins, we will contact you about orientation dates for the campus where you will be residing. (Only for students beginning in the fall semester.)
- Move in! During the designated move-in dates, you will be able to check into your residence hall after you complete all of the following:
 1. Register for 15 or more credit hours.
 2. Show proof of full payment for tuition, room, board and other fees.
 3. Attend a new student orientation at your campus.

The priority deadlines are June 15 (fall semester) and November 15 (spring semester.) However, residence halls fill on a first-come, first-serve basis, so students are encouraged to apply early.

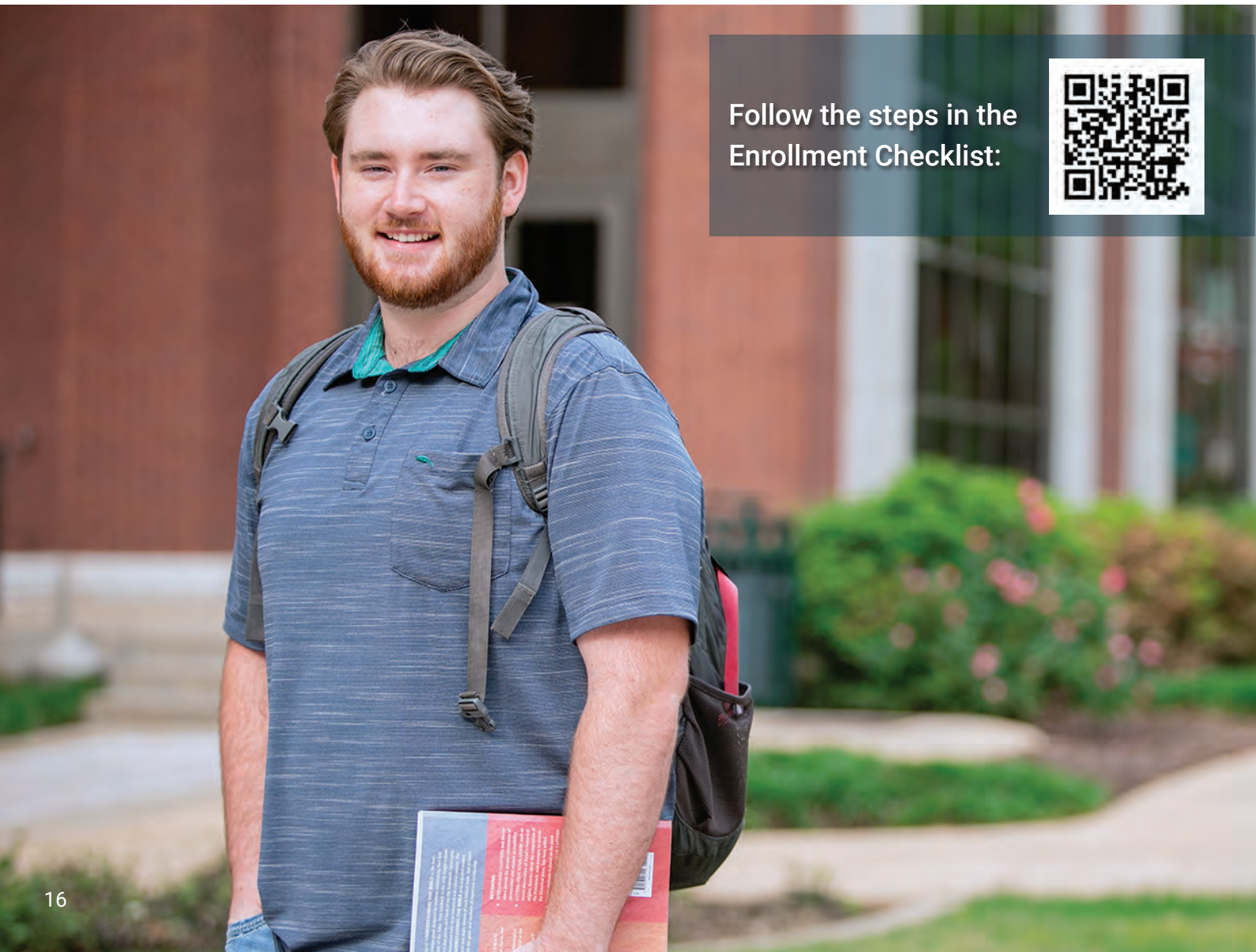

Final Prep

Get ready for the first day of classes! Be sure to take care of the following so you are prepared for a smooth start:

- ❑ Log in to your My.Hinds and Navigator accounts regularly to manage your student information and check your Hinds email. Your Hinds email is the official method of communication for all college business.
- ❑ Before classes begin, log in to Canvas (our learning management system) to ensure that you can see your registered courses. You will be able to access those course shells on the first day of class.
- ❑ Have your student ID badge made before classes begin. Bring a picture ID and your class schedule to any Hinds campus. Get details at hindscc.edu/IDs.
- ❑ You will be charged for textbooks at the time you register for classes, and our Barnes & Noble bookstore will prepare your Book Bundle. One month before classes begin, you will receive an email instructing you to select your delivery preference of in-store pickup or ship directly to you, but any digital materials will be delivered within Canvas.
