

WITHDRAWAL CONSEQUENCES ROAD MAP

Before You Take the Exit – Know What's Ahead

ACADEMIC DELAYS AHEAD

- Incomplete Progress: Withdrawing means you won't earn credit for the course, which could delay your graduation.
- Course Repetition: You may need to retake the course, which could impact your schedule or seat availability.
- Transcript Record: A "W" appears on your transcript, and although it doesn't affect your GPA, excessive withdrawals can raise concerns for future schools or employers.

FINANCIAL AID PIT STOP

- Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP): Most financial aid programs require you to complete at least 67% of your attempted coursework. Too many withdrawals can cause you to fall below this requirement.
- Loss of Aid Eligibility: Falling below SAP standards can lead to the loss of financial aid, including grants, loans, and scholarships.
- Repayment Risk: In some cases, especially with federal aid, withdrawing from all classes may trigger a repayment obligation.

3 ACADEMIC EMERGENCY SERVICES

- Meet with your instructor to discuss your challenges.
- Schedule an appointment with a Retention Specialist or Academic Advisor.
- Take advantage of the many support resources available to you, including Free Tutoring, Academic Coaching, Mental Health Counseling, and Faculty Office Hours.

A FINAL DESTINATION

- Advisor Consultation Required: Always meet with an academic or retention specialist before withdrawing. We can help you explore other options, like tutoring, academic coaching, or temporary accommodations.
- Alternative Support: Struggling in class? Don't withdraw without exploring academic support services first—you're not alone!
